## Sample Briefings

These briefings are made to be as simple and uncomplicated as possible. Feel free to tailor to your specific flight

## **Sample Passenger Brief**

- 1. Safety
  - a. Seatbelts and shoulder harnesses. How to fasten AND unfasten
  - b. How to open and close doors and windows
  - c. When to be quiet, when to speak up
  - d. Look for traffic
  - e. Fire extinguishers
- 2. Comfort
  - a. How to open and close windows and air vents
  - b. Sick bags (optional)
  - c. Speak up if uncomfortable

## **Sample Takeoff Briefing**

The takeoff briefing has you verbalize and visualize your environment and course of action should it be needed in case of emergency. It should include:

- 1. What runway you're using and direction of turnout
- 2. How much runway you need
- 3. Wind conditions
- 4. Emergency procedures

Example: "We are taking off on Runway 29 and departing to the south. Runway is 5000' long and based on today's calculations, we need 1,500' to clear any obstacles. We have a slight right crosswind. If the engine fails below 200 AGL, I am going to push the nose down and land straight ahead. If it fails between 200' – 800' AGL, I will turn slightly right and try to land in the fields to the right of the airport."

## Sample Approach Brief

- Runway
- 2. Wind direction
- 3. Anything unusual

Example: "I'm landing on Runway 10, we'll have a strong left crosswind. This airport has no taxiway, so I'll need to back taxi."
